Each of the activities can be done using the international Nature Passport app and there are over one hundred more to choose from



Activity 1: Cape Peron Point Peron Road, Peron

Wildlife Safari

Let's go exploring!

Lake Richmond is an important habitat and breeding ground for a large range of wildlife, including fish, insects, reptiles and birds.

When you arrive at the lake, find a good spot to watch, listen and observe the wildlife around you.

Fun fact! Lake Richmond is home to a community of thrombolites, which are one of Earth's earliest life forms. See if you can spot them near the boardwalk!

Did you know... Lake Richmond is an important place for Nyoongar people. They believed that the Waugal, a snake and the life and spirit of water, created water bodies and sand dunes as it moved across the land. Lake Richmond is one of the places that is believed to be created by the Waugal.

Activity 3: City Park Westralia Gardens, Rockingham


