Baldivis Sports Complex

A new unique public artwork has been installed at the Baldivis Sports Complex, with *Karrikins Dirdong* lighting up the area between the Indoor Sports Complex and the Main Pavilion.

The sculpture by artists Jason Hirst and Peter Farmer depicts the six Nyoongar seasons and aims to be both aesthetically pleasing and educational. The intent of the artwork is to depict the connection to the land, new growth and development.

Construction was also recently completed on the Baldivis Indoor Sports Complex (BISC). The BISC features four indoor courts for basketball, netball, badminton, volleyball, indoor soccer and floorball, multipurpose rooms, a café and merchandise.

With the facility now open for community sport, the White Knights Baldivis Cricket Club has enjoyed a full summer season and the Baldivis Brumbies Football Club is busy preparing for the winter AFL season.

Looking ahead, the next phase of the BSC that the City will deliver includes the Junior Pavilion, Baldivis Outdoor Recreation Space and the outdoor hardcourts.

The Southern Pavilion will service a cricket wicket and senior and junior football ovals, while the outdoor hardcourts will be utilised for netball.

The new Baldivis Outdoor Recreation Space will be an inclusive space that includes a nature playground, skate park, adventure play areas and an activity challenge course.

Upgrades Coming at Stan Twight Reserve

The final concept plan for the Stan Twight Reserve Clubroom Redevelopment has been adopted by Council.

The facility, which is located on Hennessey Way in Rockingham, is home to the Safety Bay Stingers Football Club, Shoalwater Bay Cricket Club and the Rockingham Districts Masters Football Club.

Consultation with the clubs has been central to the design, and the final concept plan for the project will see the City construct a new clubroom and change rooms.

Gender equitable change rooms and umpires change rooms will be part of the design, along with the delivery of a larger car park. Detailed design is now underway on the project.

Additional works which will occur at the reserve include the relocation of two turf cricket wickets, establishing a floodlit main AFL oval, and creating space for two senior size AFL and cricket fields, and an additional synthetic cricket wicket for junior and women's cricket competitions.



Aqua Jetty Stage Two Flythrough The Aqua Jetty, located on Warnbro Sound Avenue in Warnbro, is the City's premier aquatic and health facility. It will soon undergo an expansion and major refurbishment to cater for the City's population growth and to improve access and amenity for the community.

Design work on stage two of the Aqua Jetty is progressing, and a new flythrough video that highlights some of the major elements of this exciting project is now available on the City's website via rockingham.wa.gov.au/planning-and-building/current-projects-and-works/aqua-jetty-stage-two

Strategic Community Plan - Major Review

A major review of the City's Strategic Community Plan (SCP) is currently underway and we have been out and about in the community encouraging residents to share their thoughts about the future.

The SCP is a regularly updated 10-year plan to guide our City's development. Through extensive community consultation the plan defines the community's vision for the future in our local government area, including the overarching aspirations and specific service expectations. This information then drives the development of our other plans, resourcing and strategies.

Every four years we undertake a major review of our SCP to ensure you have the opportunity to help shape our City. Community consultation for this review, which began in November 2022, has so far included:



Community focus group workshops



A community survey



Pop-up consultations in local shopping centres, libraries, and facilities, as well as at selected City events



Consultation through surveys and workshops with local schools, businesses and the City's advisory committees.

Adding to that wealth of resident feedback, in February 2023, 15,000 randomly selected households were invited to help us establish the vision and priorities for the 2023-2033 Plan.

Keep an eye out for the draft plan developed from this consultation, which will be presented to Council before being advertised for further community feedback. The final plan for 2023 – 2033 will be adopted by Council in mid-2023.

The City was one of the first local governments involved in Grow it Local, which is a community initiative that encourages people to grow, share and eat locally grown foods.



Keeping our City Clean

Who are you going to call when there's rubbish in the neighbourhood? That's easy - contact LitterBusters.

The City's LitterBusters team is responsible for removing any form of litter and illegal dumping on City property.

They strive to enhance the cleanliness and general appearance of our City, reduce the impact of litter on the environment, monitor illegal dumping and litter hotspots, as well as generally maintaining paths, boardwalks and other areas.

Over the past year LitterBusters responded to more than 2841 reports from the community. In that time they've collected approximately 31.8 tonnes of litter per month, which adds up to about 382 tonnes of litter over the course of the year.

Reporting Graffiti

Graffiti comes in many shapes and forms and is a type of vandalism that impacts property across our region.

We understand the impact graffiti can have on the wider community, which is why the City works closely with a variety of stakeholders, including WA Police, to tackle the issue.

Through the City's dedicated Graffiti Removal Program nearly 2,500 incidents of reported graffiti were removed in 2021/2022. This equated to almost 10,600 square metres, and cost the City approximately \$240,000.

You can help to keep our City looking beautiful, clean and safe by reporting graffiti vandalism. You can report graffiti by:

Does your storm plan consider your pets?

With winter approaching, it is vital you are prepared by having a storm plan.

Consider things such as where your emergency kit is kept, where will you go if you need to leave, what items need to be secured, and where will your pets and animals shelter?

Mobile phones, landline and internet services may not be available, so ensure that you have a portable battery powered radio and a battery pack for your mobile.

To assist you in planning, the Department of Fire and Emergency Services has a helpful Storm Smart Brochure which is available via **publications.dfes.wa.gov.au/ publications/storm-smart-brochure**

State Emergency Services can be contacted on **132 500** for urgent property repairs that you cannot fix yourself. Call **000** for life threatening emergencies.

Creating a Safer City

One of the City's key safety initiatives is SmartWatch, which is a vehicle-based high visibility security patrol service that carries out regular, coordinated patrols across the City to deter criminal and anti-social behaviour.

Community members can contact SmartWatch to report and monitor anti-social behaviour, hooning, neighbourhood disturbances, vandalism and graffiti. In the past year SmartWatch has responded to 1758 requests along with extensive proactive patrols of areas deemed as hot spots due to recent activity.

The service works closely with the local police to ensure that both services are fully informed of what is happening in our community.

Bushfires remain a major threat to our community, so during the summer months the patrols also play an important role in fire watch, focusing on our bushfire prone areas. These rural patrols increase the potential for the identification of early ignition of a bushfire or indeed if anyone is out there lighting fires.

SmartWatch can also keep an eye on your home if you are away for travel or work for more than one night, and over the past 12 months SmartWatch has provided this service for more than 400 families in our community. If you haven't yet used this service it is one that you should certainly consider for the future.
