Advocacy

As the City continues to grow, we face a range of complex issues. Many of them are well within our capacity to deal with on our own. Others, such as job creation, community services, and major infrastructure, to name a few, need the involvement of the State and federal governments. That's why we have developed an advocacy plan that guides our efforts to secure support from other levels of government in key areas.

Over the past year our advocacy efforts secured \$1 million from the State Government's Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Fund to assist in the Stan Twight Reserve redevelopment, as well as \$1 million from Lotterywest for the Baldivis Outdoor Recreation Space.

Advocacy is a journey. It can take a while to get a result, but it is important that we stay the course on issues that are important to our community.

Since 2019 our advocacy efforts have successfully secured more than \$27.7 million in grant funding for several community infrastructure projects.





Karnup Train Station

Planning for the proposed Karnup Station has a long history. It has been part of the State Government's Metronet program for many years, but was postponed after the federal government provided funding to the State Government to build a station at Lakelands in 2019.

In May 2023 the State Government announced it was seeking a public-private partnership to build the station and develop the land in the surrounding area as a 'Neighbourhood Centre' with housing, local employment, retail, services and amenities. The submission period closed in July 2023 and the outcome of that process is not yet known.

Meanwhile, the journey continues, and the City will keep advocating for a station at Karnup to meet growing demand.

Defence in Focus

There are not many places in Australia where the AUKUS Defence partnership will have as much local impact as right here in the City of Rockingham. With up to \$8 billion to be invested in HMAS Stirling at Garden Island, and a major increase in the number of personnel on the base, it will have a sustained positive impact on our local economy.

AUKUS will also bring some challenges. The City is meeting regularly with the Navy and with State and federal representatives to put forward issues that need to be addressed from the community's point of view, such as transport, housing, infrastructure and education opportunities to cater for the growth in defence-related activity within our region.

We have already hosted a US Defence Department forward planning team to help them gain a better understanding of the City of Rockingham area, including housing opportunities, entertainment and shopping precincts, and development-ready land.

New Plan for our Youngest Community Members

The City of Rockingham aims to support children, young people and their families to be part of a healthy, happy, and productive community. To help achieve that goal we are developing a new Strategy for Early Years, Children and Young People. Extensive consultation with the community has been conducted, including two surveys (one specifically for young people aged 12 – 24 years), and seven workshops (two specifically for young people).





Environment

Be Waterwise this Summer

Maintaining healthy gardens and reducing water use during hot summers can be challenging. Stay waterwise this summer:



Top up your garden with mulch to reduce evaporation loss and weed growth.



Keep showers under four minutes. Household showering can account for 24% of total water use.



Look out for leaks. Water Corporation has a handy leak detection test on its website.



Keep your pool or spa covered when not in use to reduce evaporation.



Wash a full load of clothes – this can save up to 15,000 litres a year.



Turning off the tap while brushing your teeth, and storing drinking water in the fridge instead of waiting for it to run cold from the tap, can save up to 10 litres per minute.



Battery Electric Equipment Trial

The City's Parks Services team is trialling a specially modified vehicle designed to carry and charge battery-powered small equipment such as line trimmers, blowers, hedge trimmers and chainsaws. The vehicle has two solar panels to charge the batteries and a robust battery storage (and charging) setup to ensure batteries aren't damaged in transit.

The City currently uses over 400 pieces of petrol-powered equipment so this pilot program will be an important step towards reducing our reliance on fossil-fuel. Battery electric equipment also reduces operating costs and is generally quieter to operate.

The pilot program began in October and will show us how to best proceed with the rollout of battery electric powered small equipment on a wider scale.



Protecting Our Environment

The City of Rockingham maintains over 1,000 hectares of natural environment, and has developed a range of plans that aim to conserve and guide the management of our important environmental assets. The City's Greening Plan, Wetland Management Plan and Foreshore Management Plan are currently being reviewed and updated to ensure the recommended actions are improving the health and biodiversity value of our natural areas, including the City's tree canopy, important wetlands, and coastal areas.

Be Bushfire Aware This Summer

You are only as resilient as your community. During bushfire season, it's vitally important to stay informed about any declared Total Fire Bans, and to be aware of the **Australian Fire Danger Ratings.** The ratings predict and describe the potential level of danger if a bushfire starts.

Prepare an emergency kit and check your bushfire plan. If you don't have a plan make one as soon as possible with the help of the Australian Red Cross "Get Prepared" app.

Fire Prevention

Firebreak inspections commenced on all properties on 1 December 2023 with high risk rural and semi-rural lots. The City is now in a prohibited burning period until 31 March 2024. During this period, no burning is allowed on any property in Rockingham, and this includes all beaches within the City.

Subsidy Scheme Help Available

Did you know you may be eligible to apply for one or more of the three Subsidy Scheme reimbursements up to the value of \$150 offered to qualifying residents of the City on a low income?

- Safety Subsidy Scheme To assist residents to make their homes safer and more secure. (One application per household per financial year).
- Home Modification and Assistive Equipment – To assist residents over 60 years old to manage their everyday tasks and remain longer in their own home. (One application per resident per financial year).
- Information Technology Scheme To assist residents over 60 years old to become more connected with friends, family resources and information. (One application per resident per financial year).
