Pickleball at Baldvis Indoor Sports Complex and Mike Barnett Sports Complex

Pickleball is a racket or paddle sport in which two or four players hit a perforated, hollow, plastic ball with paddles over an 86 cm high net, until one side is unable to return the ball or commits a rule infraction.

Pickleball is quickly becoming a popular game for seniors as the light ball and low nets assist players to keep up with the ball while lowering strain on elbows and joints with the lower nets. The game is played indoors at both City facilities to keep players dry and wind protected.
