General Waste Verge Collection

The following **WILL** be collected:

- ✓ Whitegoods (fridges and freezers) collected separately
- E-waste (TVs and computer hardware) collected separately
- ✓ Old furniture (with glass removed) (up to 1.5 m in length)
- ✓ Timber (up to 1.5 m in length)
- ✓ Mattresses collected separately
- ✓ Other metal collected separately.

The following **WILL NOT** be collected:

- ★ Waste exceeding 1.5 m in length
- **x** Green waste, bags of leaves or grass, stumps or palm logs
- **×** Food waste
- × Car bodies, vehicle parts or tyres
- **x** Batteries or items with integrated batteries
- × Paints, chemicals, oils or gas bottles
- ★ Asbestos, Hardifence, Super Six (fibre cement) products, bricks, sand, cement, concrete or building rubble
- × All glass including plate glass, shower screens, glass tables or mirrors.

Place out no more than two days prior to collection date.

Maximum total per property is 2 m³



Verge Collection Do's and Don'ts

PLEASE:

- ✓ Place waste neatly on your own verge no more than two days prior to your scheduled collection date.
- ✓ Place waste collected separately (fridges, other metals, e-waste and mattresses) in separate piles from your other waste.
- Place on your own verge by Monday 6am on your scheduled start date for your area as the contractor will only check the verge once.
- Allow seven working days for collection.
- Keep on checking your pile as it is your responsibility throughout the collection.

PLEASE DON'T:

- × Obstruct the footpath, your bin service or the line of sight of pedestrians, cyclists and cars.
- \times Place waste too close to fences, trees, cars, power domes, or other objects that may get damaged when waste is collected.
- Place your waste inside your property line.
- × Place your waste on any other verge as it will not be collected from vacant land and public reserves.
- × Place out more than the allowed volume.

Verge waste is collected from your verge with machinery which can damage artificial turf.


The following **WILL** be collected:

★ General waste, junk or whitegoods.
