Your Waste Services

When you sort your waste correctly, you help keep the system working too.

General Waste Verge Collection

The following **WILL** be collected:

- ✓ Whitegoods (fridges and freezers)*
- ✓ E-waste*
- ✓ Old furniture (with glass removed)
up to 1.5 m in length
- ✓ Timber up to 1.5 m in length
- ✓ Mattresses*
- ✓ Other metal*.

The following **WILL NOT** be collected:

- ✗ Waste exceeding 1.5 m in length
- ✗ Green waste
- ✗ Food waste or bean bags
- ✗ Batteries or items with built-in batteries[#]
- ✗ Paints, chemicals, oils or gas bottles[#]
- ✗ Asbestos[#], fibre cement products,
bricks, sand, cement, concrete or rubble
- ✗ All glass including plate glass, shower
screens, glass tables or mirrors.



[#]Must be disposed of in accordance with household hazardous waste guidelines.

*Collected separately

Place out no more than two days prior to collection date.

**Maximum total
per property is 2 m³**

Verge Collection

Do's and Dont's

Do:

- ✓ Place waste neatly on your own verge no earlier than two days before your collection starts.
- ✓ Separate items into different piles keeping recyclable items (such as fridges, metal items, e-waste and mattresses) separate from general waste.
- ✓ Place all waste on your verge by 6am Monday of your scheduled start week. The contractor will only check once.
- ✓ Allow up to seven working days for collection and check your pile regularly.
- ✓ Advise the City in advance if waste is shared between neighbouring properties.

Don't:

- ✗ Obstruct footpaths, bin services or visibility for pedestrians, cyclists or vehicles.
- ✗ Place waste near fences, trees, cars, power domes or other items that may get damaged during collection.
- ✗ Place waste inside property boundaries, on vacant land, public reserves or another property's verge.
- ✗ Place waste on reticulation or near plants.
- ✗ Exceed the allowed volume limits (2 m³ for general waste, 3 m³ for green waste).

Green Waste Verge Collection

The following **WILL** be collected:

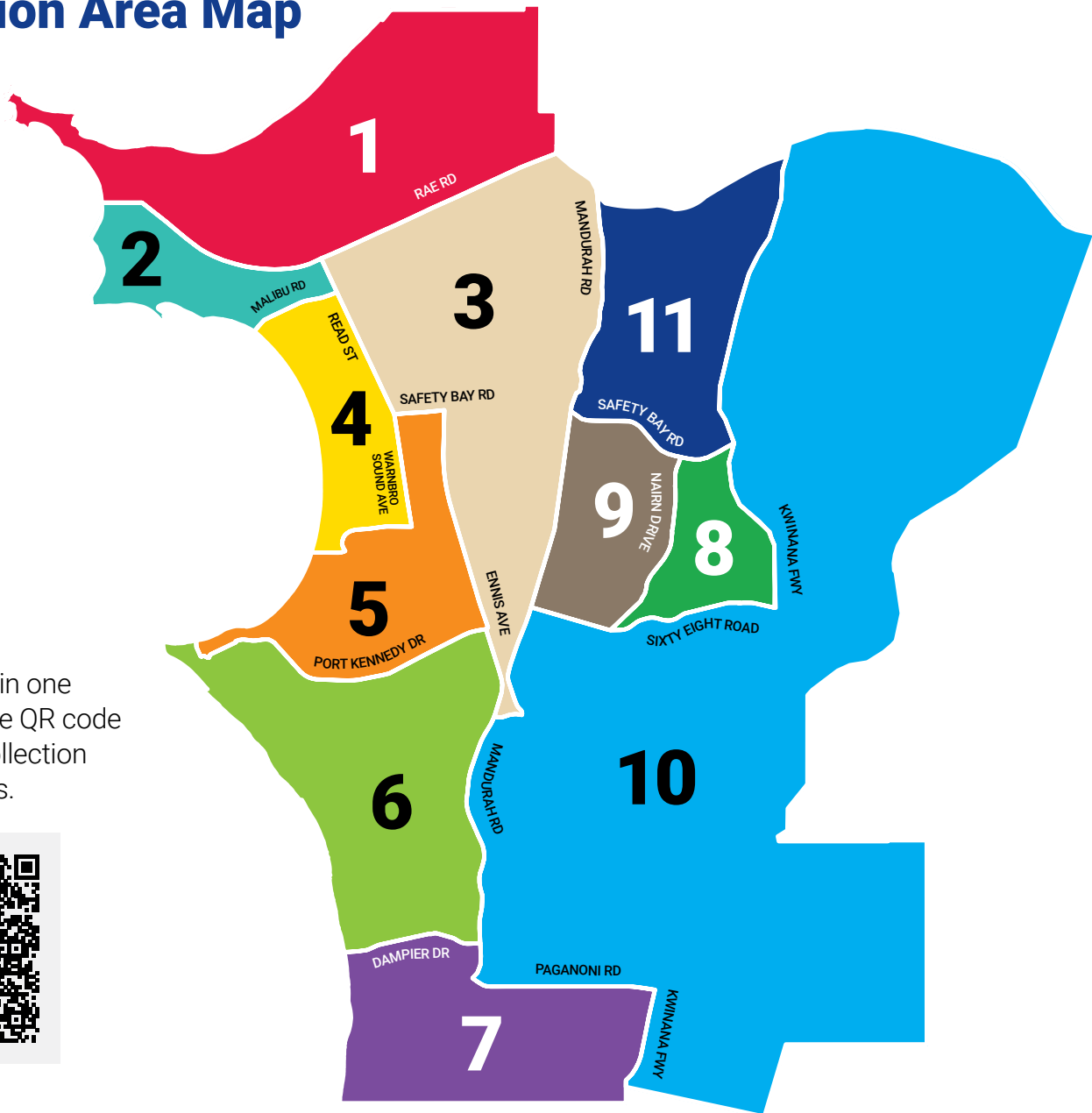
- ✓ Tree and shrub prunings up to 1.5 m in length and 350 mm in diameter.

The following **WILL NOT** be collected:

- ✗ Leaves, lawn clippings or dug out lawn
- ✗ Bagged or boxed leaves, grass, weeds or roots
- ✗ Sand or soil materials
- ✗ Branches over 1.5 m in length or 350 mm in diameter
- ✗ General waste, junk or whitegoods.

Tip Passes

If you have tip passes, you can drop off items at Millar Road Landfill Facility outside of your collection dates. City of Rockingham rate payers receive four tip passes each year on their rates notice. Each tip pass can be used for up to 1.5 m³ of general or green waste. If you're a tenant, check with your landlord.



Hazardous Waste

Placing hazardous waste in your verge collection and general waste bin can be dangerous. Hazardous household waste can be dropped off for free (or for a small fee) at the Millar Road Landfill Facility.

This includes:

- ✓ Aerosols
- ✓ Household chemicals, including cleaning, pool and garden chemicals
- ✓ Methylated spirits/turpentine
- ✓ Flares (up to 10)
- ✓ Lithium batteries
- ✓ Car batteries
- ✓ Smoke detectors
- ✓ Fire extinguishers (red only)*
- ✓ Pesticides
- ✓ Solvents
- ✓ Fluoro tubes and light fittings.

Vapes cannot be accepted at the Millar Road Landfill Facility and are not recyclable at this time.

*costs may apply.

Changes to Additional Red Bin Eligibility

As of July 1 2026 the second general waste bin will be available to households of five or more for the concessional rate of \$80.70 per year - that's \$1.55 a week.

Residents managing medical related waste can access an additional red lid bin at no cost, with weekly collection. Conditions apply. If you're a tenant, check with your landlord.

FOGO Caddy Liners Available for Collection From 1 July 2026

City of Rockingham residents can collect two rolls of compostable caddy liners by presenting proof of address at the City's Administration Building, Libraries or the Millar Road Landfill Facility from 1 July 2026.

Waste Collection Days

Each week, place two bins on your kerb by 6am. Your green lidded FOGO bin is collected weekly, while your recycling and general waste bins are collected fortnightly on alternating weeks.
